Part 2. A general authorization for the release of medical or other information is NOT sufficient for this purpose.



Patient Consent for Buprenorphine Treatment

Patient information and consent to treatment with buprenorphine

Buprenorphine is an FDA approved medication for treatment of people with heroin or other opioid addiction. Buprenorphine can be used for detoxification or for maintenance therapy. Maintenance therapy can continue as long as medically necessary. There are other treatments for opiate addiction, including methadone, naltrexone, and some treatments without medications that include counseling, groups and meetings.

If you are dependent on opiates – any opiates - you should be in as much withdrawal as possible when you take the first dose of buprenorphine. It you are not in withdrawal, buprenorphine can cause severe opiate withdrawal. For that reason, you should take the first dose in morning at home after waking up. We recommend that you arrange not to drive after your first dose, because some patients get drowsy until the correct dose is determined for them. Some patients find that it takes several days to get used to the transition from the opiate they had been using to buprenorphine. During that time, any use of other opiates may cause an increase in symptoms. After you become stabilized on buprenorphine, it is expected that other opiates will have less effect. Attempts to override the buprenorphine by taking more opiates could result in an opiate overdose. You should not take any other medication without discussing it with the physician first.

Combining buprenorphine with alcohol or other sedating medications is dangerous. The combination of buprenorphine with benzodiazepines (such as Valium®, Librium®, Ativan®, Xanax®, Klonopin®, etc.) has resulted in deaths

Although buprenorphine has not been shown to be liver-damaging, your doctor will monitor your liver tests while you are taking buprenorphine (This is a blood test).

The form of buprenorphine you will be taking is a combination of buprenorphine with a short acting opiate blocker (Naloxone). It will maintain physical dependence, and if you discontinue it suddenly, you will likely experience withdrawal. If you are not already dependent, you should not take buprenorphine, it could eventually cause physical dependence.

Buprenorphine sublingual films/tablets or buccal film must be held/left in place until they dissolve completely. You will be given your prescription, if deemed appropriate for outpatient therapy, at your initial consultation. You will start the taking the medication the subsequent morning after waking up. You will have to wait as it dissolves, and for two hours after it dissolves, to see how you react. It is important not to talk or swallow until the film/tablet dissolves. This takes up to ten minutes. Buprenorphine is then

absorbed over the next 30 to 120 minutes from the tissue under the tongue. Buprenorphine will not be absorbed from the stomach if it is swallowed.

If you swallow the film/tablet, you will not have the important benefits of the medication, and it may not relieve your withdrawal. Most patients end up at a daily dose of 12 mg to 24 mg of buprenorphine (Suboxone, other formulation doses differ a little) (this is roughly equivalent to 60mg of methadone maintenance). Beyond that dosage, the effects of buprenorphine plateau, so there may not be any more benefit to increase in dose. It may take several weeks to determine just the right dose for you. The first dose is usually 4 mg (Suboxone).

YOU WILL BE REQUIRED to participate in psychosocial counseling with a psychiatrist/ psychologist/ mental health counselor/ or chemical dependency counselor in addition to regular NA meeting attendance. You will have a urine drug screen at each appointment and additionally there will be random drug confirmation testing for which you are financially responsible. This is to prove you are taking your medication and will also be a more stringent check on other illegal substances than the actual drug screen in the office. These will cost anywhere from an additional \$30-\$100. You will also be monitored through the Washington State Prescription Drug Monitoring Program as well. The first 3-5 visits will be every 2 weeks and compliance with the treatment plan is required before your doctor will increase the length of time between visits from 2 to 4 weeks or longer. If you are not compliant with your treatment plan you may be fired from the practice or if you display unacceptable behavior or drug diversion while being treated at this practice.

If you are transferring to buprenorphine from methadone maintenance, your dose has to be tapered until you have been below 30 mg methadone for at least a week. There must be at least 72-96 hours (preferably longer) between the time you take your last methadone dose and the time you are given your first dose of buprenorphine. Your doctor will examine you for clear signs of withdrawal, and you will not be instructed to take your first dose of buprenorphine until you are in withdrawal.

Failure to make payment, within the agreed time(s) allotted will result in collection activity. The patient and/or responsible party will assume all financial costs assigned by the collection agency, attorney and/or court, in addition to the original patient balance. A Non-sufficient Funds (NSF) Fee of \$25.00 will be applied to the patient and/or responsible party balance for any returned check(s). At that point, any/all future payments must be made in cash, money order or credit/debit transactions.

Patient Rights

As an individual receiving services through Coho Medical Group/ Bellevue Suboxone Clinic, you have the right:

To receive services regardless of your race, national origin, religion, gender, sexual orientation, age, disability, marital status, or diagnosis.

To be treated with consideration, respect and dignity, including privacy in treatment.

To not subjected to: Abuse; Neglect; Exploitation; Coercion; Manipulation; Sexual abuse; Sexual assault; Seclusion; Restraint, if not necessary to prevent imminent harm to self or others; Retaliation for submitting a complaint to the Department or another entity; or Misappropriation of personal and private property by a unclassified health care institution's personnel members, employees, volunteers, or students; and A patient or the patient's representative

HIPAA COMPLIANCE NOTICE OF PRIVACY PRACTICES

This notice describes how medical information about you may be used and disclosed, and how you can get access to this information. This information will include the Protected Health Information (PHI), as that term is defined in privacy regulations issued by the United States Department of Health and Human Services pursuant to the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 ("HIPAA") and, as applicable, RCW Chapter 70.02 entitled "Medical records—Healthcare Access and Disclosure." Please review it carefully.

We, at Coho Medical Group/ Bellevue Suboxone Clinic, understand that your personal health information is very sensitive. We will not disclose your information to others unless you tell us to do so, or unless the law authorizes or requires me to do so.

The law protects the privacy of the health information We create and obtain in providing care and services to you. For example, your protected health information includes your symptoms, test results, diagnoses, treatment, health information from other providers, and billing and payment information relating to these services. Federal and state law allows us to use and disclose your protected health information for purposes of treatment and health care operations. State law requires us to get your authorization to disclose this information for payment purposes.

Protected Health Information (PHI): Protected health information means individually identifiable health information, which is: transmitted by electronic means, maintained in any means described in the definition of electronic media; or transmitted or maintained in any other form or medium.

Examples of use and disclosures of Protected Health Information for *Treatment, Payment, and Health Operations are:*

Treatment:

- information obtained by a nurse, physician, clinical psychologist, MSW, therapist, or other member of the treatment team will be recorded in your medical record and used to help decide what care may be right for you.
- We may also provide information to others providing you care. This will help them stay informed about your care.

Payment:

• In Washington State, written patient permission is required to use or disclose PHI for payment purposes, including to your health insurance plan. We will have you sign another form "Assignment of Benefits" or a similar form for this purpose (RCW 70.02.030(b). Health plans need information from me for your medical care. Information provided to health plans may include your diagnoses, procedures performed, or recommended care.

Health care operations:

- We may use your medical records to assess quality and improve services.
- We may contact you to remind you about appointments and give you information about treatment alternatives or other health related benefits and services.
- We may use and disclose your information to conduct and arrange for services, including: medical review by your health plan; accounting, legal, risk management, and insurance services; audit

functions, including fraud and abuse detection and compliance programs.

Your health information rights.

The health and billing records we create and store are the property of Coho Medical Group. The protected health information in it, however, generally belongs to you.

You have a right to:

- Receive, read, and ask questions about this notice;
- Ask us to restrict certain uses and disclosures. You must deliver this request in writing to me. We are not required to grant that request. But we will comply with any request granted;
- Request and receive from me a paper copy of the most current Notice of Privacy Practices for Protected Health Information ("Notice").
- Request that you be allowed to see and get a copy of your protected health information. You may make this request in writing. We have a form available for this type of request.
- Have us review a denial of access to your health information—except in certain circumstances.
- Ask us to change your health information. You may give us this request in writing. You may write a statement of disagreement if your request is denied. It will be stored in your medical record, and included with any release of your records.
- When you request, we will give you a list of disclosures of your health information. The list will not include disclosures to 3rd party payers. You may receive this information without charge once every 12 months. We will notify you of the cost involved if you request this information more than once every twelve months.
- As that your health information be given to you by another means or at another location. Please sign, date, and give us your request in writing.
- Cancel prior authorizations to sue or disclose health information by giving us a written revocation. Your revocation does not affect information that has already been released. It also does not affect any action taken before we have it. Sometimes, you cannot cancel an authorization if its purpose was to obtain insurance.

Psychotherapy notes:

These are notes recorded (in any medium) by a healthcare provider who is a mental health professional documenting or analyzing the contents of a conversation during a private counseling session or a group, joint, or family counseling session and that are separated from the rest of the individual's record. Psychotherapy notes excludes medication prescriptions and monitoring, counseling session start and stop times, the modalities or frequencies of treatment provided, results of clinical tests, and any summary of the following items: diagnosis, functional status, the treatment plan, symptoms, prognosis, and progress to date. An authorization to use or disclose psychotherapy notes is required except if used by the originator of the notes for treatment, to a person or persons reasonably able to prevent or lessen the threat (including the target of the threat), if the originator believes in good faith that the use or disclosure is necessary to prevent or lessen a serious and imminent threat to the health or safety of a person or the public, if the notes are to be used in the course of training students, trainees or practitioners in mental health; to defend a legal action or any other legal proceeding brought forth by the patient; when used by a medical examiner or coroner; for health oversight activities of the originator; or when required by the law.

Our responsibilities.

We are required to:

- -Keep your protected health information private.
- -Give you this notice.
- -Follow the terms of this Notice.

To ask for help or to make a complaint.

If you have questions, want more information, or want to report a problem about the handling of your protected health information, contact Coho Medical Group/ Bellevue Suboxone Clinic, 1515 116th Ave NE, Bellevue, WA 98004.

If you believe your privacy rights have been violated, you may discuss your concerns with the Privacy Officer. You may send a written complaint to the Washington State Department of Health at: 510 4th Ave. W., Suite 404, Seattle, WA 98119.

You may also file a complaint with the U.S. Secretary of Health and Human Services. We respect your right to file a complaint with me or to the Secretary of HHS, and We will not retaliate against you.

Other disclosures and uses of Protected Health Information.

Notification of family and others.

Unless you object, we may release health information about you to a friend or family member who is involved in your medical care. We may also give information to someone who helps pay for your care. We may tell your family or friends your condition and that you are in a hospital. In addition, we may disclose health information about you to assist in disaster relief efforts. You have the right to object to this use or disclosure of your information. If you object, we will not use or disclose it.

Other use or disclosure of your Protected Health Information without your authorization is:

- With medical researchers—if the research has been approved and has policies to protect the privacy of your health information. We may also share information with medical researchers preparing to conduct a research project.
- To the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) relating to problems with food, supplements, and products.
- To comply with Workers' Compensations Laws if you have made workers' compensation claims.
- For Public Health and Safety Purposes as allowed or required by law: -to prevent or reduce a serious, immediate threat to the health or safety of a person or the public. -to public health or legal authorities. -to protect public health and safety -to prevent or control disease, injury, or disability -to report vital statistics such births or deaths.
- To report suspected abuse or neglect to public authorities.
- To correctional institutions if you are in jail or prison, as necessary for your health and the health and safety of others.
- For law enforcement purposes such as when we receive a subpoena, court order, or other legal process, or you are a victim of a crime.
- For health and safety oversight activities. For example, we may share health information with the Department of Health.

More important, if you choose to sign an authorization to disclose information, you may revoke that authorization at a later time to stop any future use and disclosure.

Uses and disclosures not in this Notice will be made only as allowed or required by law or with your written authorization.

Suboxone Induction Instructions

Step 1) Take ½ film sublingually once then wait 2 hours

Day 1: You must be in moderate withdrawal--COWS score >10 ideally > 13

---->if ok and no further withdrawal then stop and call office to update us at 425-223-5629

---->if still in withdrawal go to step 2

Step 2) Take another ½ film sublingually once then wait another 2 hours

----> if ok and no further withdrawal then stop and call office to update us at 425-223-5629 ----> if still in withdrawal go to step 3

Step 3) Take another ½ film, sublingually once----This is the maximum dosage for Day 1. Please wait 2 hours and call office to update us at 425-223-5629

Day 2: You should have mild to moderate withdrawal at this time only

Step 1) Take total dose from Day 1 sublingually in the AM and wait 2 hours

- ----> if no further withdrawal this is your daily dosage ----> if still in withdrawal go to step 2
- Step 2) Take another $\frac{1}{2}$ film sublingually once wait 2 hours then call the office to update us at 425-223-5629
- Day 3: Continue to take the dose you have determined that will keep your withdrawal under control. You may still feel mild cravings, irritability or trouble going to sleep but this will subside over the next 1-2 weeks.
- ***Consider melatonin 5 mg orally in the evening if having trouble sleeping
- ***Consider taking Miralax 1 packet/ scoop or 17grams dissolved in water daily if having trouble with constipation
- ***Call the office with any concerns or issues, make appointment for therapist and go to NA meetings
